Summer is the time of vacations, the time for trips into the great outdoors. As we make our travel plans, maybe we can learn a valuable lesson from the following little story:

A family was on its way to a Sunday outing at the lake. It was midmorning when they drove by a church. Worshipers, dressed in their Sunday best, were seen gathered at the front entrance.

From the back seat of the car came the voice of five-year-old Karen: "Daddy, aren't we going to church today?" In the front seat both father and mother exchanged embarrassed glances. Since the question had been addressed to him, the father felt obliged to answer.

"We can worship God at the lake," was his short reply. There was a brief moment of silence. Then from the back seat came the sage observation of which only a five-year-old is capable: "But we won't, Daddy, will we?"

The father had sought refuge behind an evasion all too popular today, even among church members. It is true that our Lord can be worshiped at the lake. He can be worshiped in the forests, in the mountains, and along streams. But in her five short years Karen had learned that while God could be worshiped from hills or dales or lake cabins, He usually isn't.

It will call for a conscious effort on our part to include God in our vacation plans. The majestic mountains may tell us of His might, the beauty of a wooded lake may tell us of His wisdom, but only the Gospel of our Savior's tender mercy can tell us of God's love. And it is this love that we are to recall and celebrate in conscious acts of Christian worship - not only in the hushed silence of the sanctuary, but also in God's great out-of-doors. On mountaintops, in forests and valleys, beside the blue waters of lakes and streams the Christian heart can sing:

"Fair are the meadows, Fair are the woodlands,

Robed in flowers of blooming spring;

Jesus is fairer, Jesus is purer, He makes our sorrowing spirit sing..."

Oh, come, let us worship the Lord!

Quarterly Voters' Meeting August 11th at 10:30

There is a *short* Quarterly Voters Meeting scheduled for August 11th before the Pre-Call Open Forum meeting at 11:00 that day. At the Voters Meeting updates will be given on the work being completed on the maintenance and beautification outside of our church building. Information will also be given on what remains of the balance due of the parking lot. At 11:00 a.m., there will be a "Pre-Call Forum Meeting.

The Call Committee

The second meeting of the Call Committee was Wednesday evening, July 17th. The committee continued to make progress on the Congregational Self Study. The Self Study is scheduled to be completed by Wednesday July 24th.

The final part of the Self Study is tabulating the results of the Pastoral functions, traits, and abilities surveys. There were 68 total surveys; 60 members, 6 youth, and 2 non members. A total of 368 ovals (choices) were filled in. The top six traits are: People Skills (41); Preaching Delivery (32); Worship (28); Preaching Content (23); Leadership (21) and Teaching Ability (21).

Please mark your calendars for the following important dates:

- 1. Nominations are due by July 31st.
- 2. The <u>Open Forum Meeting is immediately after the Quarterly Voters meeting, approximately 11:00 a.m. Sunday August 11th.</u> Pastor Wessel will be on hand to lead the review of the Congregational Self Study. Everyone's input is appreciated.

After the Open Forum meeting The Self Study is forwarded to Pastor Lueck, District President. The next step, the Call Meeting, will be scheduled after Pastor Lueck returns a call list (based on our survey). Please, keep the Church, Call Committee, and Process in your prayers.

- Congregation meets to review documents and information (tentative 8/11)
- o Information sent to the North Wisconsin District Office
- North Wisconsin District President sends candidate list to congregation
- Call Committee meets to review candidate information and make recommendations to Zion
- Congregational Call Meeting Congregation votes to extend a Divine Call to a candidate

Lutheran Youth Fellowship

John 15:12 says, "My command is to love each other as I have loved you" and that is exactly what our group did during our week in Shoshone Mountain Retreat near Wallace, Idaho.

Four adults and seven youths left the Zion parking lot in Mondovi on Friday, June 14th to caravan 1,178 miles for a week of adventure, serving others, and growing in faith. On the way out, we took a detour to see Mount Rushmore, attend church in Missoula, and tour a real silver mine in Wallace, Idaho. Upon our arrival to Shoshone, we began our week of Idaho Servant Adventures by meeting other adults and youth from Minnesota, Colorado, Idaho, and Washington. We were divided and put in mixed groups with other youth for a total of 6 servant teams and 1 team that would stay at camp and run a day camp for local public school kids that are bussed in daily. The needs in Northern Idaho are great, and we excitedly accepted the challenges that came our way.

The servant groups that we participated in completed a wide variety of tasks out in the community, such as cutting down trees, splitting and stacking wood, organizing and fixing a shed, sanding and staining a deck, painting, power washing, weeding, helping with food distribution, mowing and weed wacking, setting up army tents, and much, much more! Each afternoon we arrived back at camp exhausted but filled with the satisfaction of a day well spent helping others and sharing God's love. We enjoyed daily morning and midday Bible studies, as well as more evening worship and praise to fill us spiritually so we could pour ourselves into serving others.

The day camp group served approximately 63 youth, ages 6-12. It was challenging at times to build a rapport with the young kids, knowing it would only be for four days and how great their needs were. A highlight was when all the adult group leaders and camp leaders would debrief at the end of every service day. Upon everyone's arrival back from all their adventure, we would all gather on the porch on these big wooden rocking chairs and really connect. It was a joy to hear about all the work accomplished, new friends helped, and all the memories made.

Each afternoon we had a few hours of recreation time after the debrief, which was time for the youth to rock climb, zip line, use the giant swing, fish, swim, tube, visit the horses, or catch a nap. The evenings were busy with programming that included a speaker, worship, and campfire on the days that it didn't rain. Many new friends and memories were made.

We would like to thank everyone that made this trip possible. Those that bought Butter Braids when we ask, those that donated egg bakes for the Easter Breakfast, those that came and ate Easter Breakfast. Also, all those that donated unwanted items to be sold at our thrift sale, bought items or baked goods, and even trusted your vehicles to us to be detailed. Through your financial support and prayers, this trip was made possible. Thank you for blessing us with this amazing servant experience!



Mondovi Area Food Pantry

The Mondovi Area Food Pantry is the August recipient of Zion's loose plate offerings. The number of families served has almost doubled since early 2023. The Pantry is financially supported by the people and organizations in Mondovi, Eleva, and Gilmanton. There is no government support. Like everyone else, higher food costs have put a strain on the budget.

Over 475 families and 1211 individuals have benefitted from the resources at the Pantry between January and June. For years every family has been offered a pound of butter, a 1 gallon milk voucher at Hansen's, and two or three meat choices. Each visitor takes home about 65 pounds of food. The number of out of area visitors is increasing, no one is turned away.

The shelves are stocked yet the warehouse is about as low as it's been in years. Food donations are always appreciated. Monetary donations go farther. The Pantry buys shelf stable food and grocery products from Feed My People (FMP) at a lower cost than retail. A can of tomato soup purchased from Feed My People costs about \$0.74.

The staff at the Mondovi Area Food Pantry thanks everyone for supporting this important service for almost 40 years.

Mondovi Area Food Pantry is located at 125 East Hudson Street in Mondovi. The Pantry takes donations, either food or monetary.
