His Name Shall Be Called ...

Advent is here! Christmas is coming! All around us we see many people, young and old, getting ready. But bright lights and decorations, trees and tinsel, cards and gifts, festive foods and parties do not guarantee genuine Christmas joy.

How do we make the most of Christmas? By directing our attention to the Christ born in Bethlehem. But we must see more than just a baby in a manger. This is "Immanuel" - God with us (Matthew 1:23), the only-begotten Son of the eternal Father in heaven. He is the greatest gift of God's love, coming into our world to save sinners like you and me.

We make the most of Christmas by keeping Christ at the center of our celebration. We do that by making room in our lives for Him, even as we make other preparations for Christmas. Jesus is the reason for the season.

Who is Jesus? Since the dawn of time, billions of people have walked on planet Earth. Of those billions of people, one stands far above all of the others in significance and importance. His name is Jesus.

Jesus never wrote a book, and yet millions of books have been written about him. Jesus never painted a picture, and yet the world's greatest art has him as its source for inspiration. Jesus never traveled very far from his birthplace, and yet his message has gone all around the world. Jesus had only a handful of followers, and yet today over 30 percent of the world's population claim to follow him. We don't know the exact date of his birth, and yet more people celebrate his birthday than any other.

During the season of Advent, we prepare to celebrate the birth of God's Son. He was given the name Jesus - a Hebrew name that means "God saves." In addition to this name, Holy Scripture calls Jesus by various titles which describe something about His person or work.

In this year's midweek Advent Services we are going to examine four titles given to Jesus in Isaiah 9:6. Those titles are "Wonderful Counselor," "Mighty God," "Everlasting Father," and "Prince of Peace." We will learn how each of these titles describes something about who Jesus is and what He did for us and for our salvation. Our Sunday Morning Bible Class will also explore these names and prophecies pointing to our Savior.

Join us at Zion for our Advent Services each Wednesday at 11 am, or at 7 pm (with an Advent fellowship meal), and learn more about who Jesus is and why He is the reason for this holiday season.

Come and worship with us also on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day, and hear again the Good News of great joy that "To you is born a Savior, who is Christ the Lord!"

Voter's Assembly Meeting Sunday, November 3, 2024

The Zion Lutheran Church Voter's Assembly meeting was called to order by Dan Heike, President at 10:30 a.m. in the Fellowship Hall. Vacancy Pastor Mark Benning opened with prayer.

Recording Secretary's Report- The minutes from the August 11, 2024 meeting were presented. A motion was made by John Gehrke to approve the minutes, seconded by Joel Lewiston. Motion carried.

Financial/Treasurer's Report- Deborah Deutscher presented the church finances. A motion was made by John Gehrke to accept the treasurer's report, seconded by Keith Reinhardt. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report- Still enjoying serving here and will continue as long as needed. I have discontinued Thursday Bible Class for now.

Board of Trustees- Dan Nowaskey reported on the carpeting of the steps at the front entrance of the church- this project might have to wait until spring 2025 due to the weather.

Elder's Report- Joe Osenga reported that the elders discussed the calling of a pastor, that the Wednesday, November 27 worship service will be the Thanksgiving service, and that they set the elder serving schedule for November. The Bible study led by Pastor Mark Benning on Thursday mornings will be "put on hold" until January 2025.

Evangelism Committee- Diane Ashwell reported that the Garm's Family Christmas Concert will be held on Saturday, December 7 at Zion with snacks and hot chocolate to be served. Saturday, December 7 is also the day of Mondovi's Holiday Parade.

Stewardship Committee- note that the council is the stewardship committee. Christian Education Committee- John Gehrke reported that the children's Christmas program will be on Sunday, December 15 at the 9:00 a.m. worship service.

Youth Committee- Joe Osenga reported that there are 6 youth and 4 chaperones planning to attend the National Youth Gathering at New Orleans in 2025.

Old Business- Mike Ashwell and those that also helped to install the fence along the creek were thanked by the assembly. There will be a 75th Anniversary celebration in 2025 to celebrate the building of the church in 1950. Members to be on a committee to plan are needed- one thing that can be included in the events of the celebration could be the burning of the mortgage.

New Business- The proposed amendment to the Bylaws for the board of trustees was discussed. Matt Mohn made a motion to accept the proposed amendment to change the number of trustees from 3 to 4 and accept their voting rotation, seconded by Laura Nowaskey. Motion carried. Next, the assembly voted on the officers for 2025. Nominations for each of the offices were opened up to the floor and with no nominations from the floor (for each of the following offices) was closed. Each of the following officers were elected were no objections- Vice President Andy Heike, Treasurer Deborah Deutscher, Elders Joe Osenga, Matt Mohn, Galen Aase, Trustees Mike Ashwell, Joel Lewiston. The Recording Secretary position still needs to be filled.

Other new business included the LWML Zone 15 Vice President Lynn Bechel reporting on the Saturday, November 9 scrapbooking event planned at Zion and a Board and Brush event planned for March 2025.

Dan Heike asked the assembly to note that a family reunion planned for June 22, 2025 has been changed to June 29, 2025.

David Reineke reported that the Saturday Men's Group that was planning to meet November 16 has been changed to November 9.

Pastor Mark Benning asked that Joel Lewiston report on his helping (with the Samaritan's Purse) in the southeast of the United States were there was so much damage from the hurricane. Joel Lewiston reported that the watermark for some of the flooded area on trees went as high as 15 feet, he helped as a day volunteer to cut downed trees and clean up property.

Ginny Gunderson reported that sales from the quilts raised \$2,575 sent to Orphan Grain Train Hurricane Relief.

The budget for 2025 will need to be considered for any changes that could be need with the calling of a pastor especially in the budget for health coverage. Ginny Gunderson made a motion to pass the proposed budget for 2025 with the addendum that the elders may need to make changes to the budget with the calling of a pastor, seconded by Dan Linse. Motion carried.

Motion to adjourn. Pastor Mark Benning closed with prayer.






Christian symbol

ADVENT COLORS — One of the season's symbolic colors is blue, representing hope. During Advent, we wait in hope to celebrate again God's coming in human form. We also look forward in hope to Christ's coming in glory at the end of the age. Purple symbolizes the royalty of Jesus, the coming Prince of Peace, and the penitence with which we receive him. Some congregations also use pink or white candles in Advent wreaths, with pink symbolizing joy and white symbolizing the Christ Child.
