

The season called "Lent" is named from an old English word for Spring, "Lencthen," which refers to the lengthening of daylight at this time of the year. Lent is a very important season of the Christian church. It's a special time set aside for reflection, repentance, and renewal.

What comes to mind when you think of Lent? Of all the seasons of the church year, Lent is the most somber. Lent may bring feelings of sadness. It's a time set aside for Christians to remember the "passion" and suffering of Jesus, 40 days leading up to the annual remembrance of the crucifixion of Jesus on Good Friday. It's a time to remember that our sinfulness caused that suffering, and it is a time to repent. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, with ashes being a symbol of penitence.

One of the great messages of Lent is forgiveness. This is a message that is central to Christians throughout the year, but one that is highlighted against what Christ endured to win forgiveness for us. God has promised that those who come humbly to Him confessing our sins and seeking forgiveness will be forgiven – not because of anything we have done, but because of what Christ has done for us. What a sense of relief that brings! What a burden is lifted!

People often choose to give something up for Lent as a spiritual discipline. While this may be good and helpful, we'd like to encourage you to take something up for Lent – take some extra time invested in prayer, in meditation on Holy Scriptures, and in worship each week with our church family.

In our Midweek Lent Services this year on Wednesdays (at 11 am and at 7 pm) we will consider "*The Hand of the Lord*" – and how God extends His strong, kind, healing, giving and forgiving hand to us in Jesus Christ. Fellowship meals with our church family will also be served at noon and at 5:15 pm each Wednesday during Lent. Come, and join us! Lent takes time. Take time for Lent! Pastor Mark Benning
