What's going on in the Call Process?

Our second Call recipient, Pastor Kyle Castens, declined in December. Pastor Castens replied in a letter to the members of Zion that his work wasn't complete at the two congregations he currently serves.

The Call Committee regrouped and met on January 6th. Pastor Wessel arrived in his Minnesota Vikings attire to the dismay of the Packer fans on the committee. In his defense, he was raised not far from the Minnesota town where Pastor Finney, our first Call candidate, resides. It was pointed out to Pastor Wessel that Iowa doesn't have a professional football team because then Minnesota would want one too!

When the harassment ended and the dust settled Pastor Wessel opened the meeting with a prayer. He assured us that our process and Call documents and offer aren't an issue, and that God works on his own time. He said some churches have been without a Pastor for three years. All members agreed to stay on the committee.

The final date for nominations was Sunday January 19th. The nomination forms were mailed to Pastor Wessel in Augusta on Monday the 20th. From there they went to Pastor Lueck at the North Wisconsin District (NWD) office in Wausau. The NWD staff will use our Congregational Profile (survey results, info on Mondovi and Buffalo County, employment, etc) and match LCMS pastors to our needs. It's typical that the members on a Call list are from outside the NWD.

The new Call list isn't expected to arrive until early March, just in time for the Easter Season. Pastor Wessel encouraged the members of the committee to keep working no matter the season. The process will continue as quickly and accurately as possible. When the Call list arrives it'll be published in the bulletin; each interested candidate's information will be reviewed; interviews will be scheduled; and a Congregational Call Committee meeting will be held.

Keep Praying for God's will in the Call Process. As always, your questions and input is appreciated by Call Committee members. "We're all in this together."

Council Meeting January 9, 2025

9 people attended. Meeting was called to order at 6:05 pm by President Dan Heike. Pastor Benning read from the Bible Isaiah chapter 60 and had prayer.

Dan reviewed the agenda from December, no minutes were available. Agenda was approved.

Treasurer report. Deb was absent, Dan noted there were few (if any) changes. He also spoke of a good-sized balance in the general fund. Approx. \$52,000 and would like to (upon approval) investigate investing a portion of the funds, perhaps \$30,000 in a 6-month CD. Joe O. reminded us that when our next Pastor arrives, money should be ready for the costs involved. All agreed that would likely happen after 6 months. Motion for

Pastors report. Vacancy Pastor Mark Benning reviewed there was a baptism in December and two guest pastors on Thanksgiving Eve and Christmas Day. Also noted there are 20 young adults in confirmation class. 7 of them are 8th graders. Pastor Benning is planning vacation time from Jan. 20th through the 31st and possibly stretching that to two weeks. Pastor Moe is covering Wed. The 22nd and Sunday the 26th. Pastor Benning will work with the elders regarding the 29th. Jane Reineke will cover confirmation classes. Sharing Table. Sue Loomis has stepped down. John Schultz has spoken with Gary Preston the manager of Sharing Table. The event happens 3 times per year. 2025 February and May are taken care of. Next will be Sep / Oct time frame. Ladies' society is not interested in taking this on. \$300 is provided by sponsors to feed 150 people. No free will offering to be taken. It takes about 12 people to prepare, serve and clean up after the meal. Asking one of the church groups to handle was discussed. Mike Ashwell will speak with electrician Nate Winberg about the balcony light and adding a plug in the communion closet, also checking price of an LED light behind the cross in the sanctuary.

Evangelism and Youth groups, nothing to report.

Christian Education, Dan H. noted there is a need for Sunday School help primarily with the younger children. Lisa Heike could help once in a while, but a set schedule would not work.

Other old business.
